



**Register Now to Receive Federal Funding for the
Railway Tank Car Specialist and
Highway Emergency Response Specialist classes at
Security and Emergency Response Training Center,
Pueblo, Colorado**



SERTC is now enrolling emergency responders in its railway Tank Car Specialist and Highway Emergency Response Specialist classes. The courses are funded by the Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Administration (DHS/FEMA) through the National Domestic Preparedness Consortium (NDPC).

The first Tank Car Specialist class began June 28 through July 2 and constitutes 5 days of dedicated hands-on, suits-on practical training in advanced response techniques for rail-related emergencies. The first Highway Emergency Response Specialist class begins July 12 through July 16 and addresses techniques for motor carrier hazardous material emergency response preparedness.

Front line responders from state, local, and tribal organizations are being accepted in the first of a series of advance, mode specific specialist and technician level courses that will prepare them with the knowledge and experience to deal successfully, effectively, and safely with large-scale emergencies involving hazardous materials and potential WMD events in their home jurisdictions.

A leadership and management course addressing surface transportation incidents is expected to receive DHS/FEMA authorization soon, significantly expanding the capabilities of public safety responders to receive practical training commensurate with their responsibilities.
